- Visit with parents regularly.

Month of January Essential Ward-Level Actions

- Visit the Primary class of children turning eight and welcome them to Children and Youth.
- Interview young men and perform priesthood ordinations.
- Interview youth for limited-use temple recommends.
- Organize Young Women classes.
- As needed, call new quorum and class presidencies. Set them apart and orient them.
- Begin holding presidency meetings and ward youth councils with new presidencies.
